Since 2017, hundreds of children in the territory have received the necessary school supplies through the **Bien équipé pour la rentrée 2023** program.

In addition, the organization issued a Entraide Mercier gift card valued at \$50, per child enrolled in the program, to enable the shopping for the back to school. Again this year was a great success. Indeed 287 children benefited from material aid.

Halloween's security advises



To keep Halloween a day of surprises and fun, here are some tips to put into practice:

- Costumes should be light-coloured and flame resistant with reflective strips so that children are more easily seen at night.
- Explain to children that calls should be made along one side of the street first and then the other, and that it's best to cross the street only at intersections or crosswalks.
- Trick or Treaters should travel in groups of four or five. Young children should be accompanied by an adult.
- Visit homes that have the porch light on.
- Make sure children know they should accept treats at the door and must not get into cars or enter the homes or apartments of strangers.
- Remind children not to eat their treats and goodies until they are examined by an adult at home. And candy should not be eaten if the package is already opened.
 Small, hard pieces of candy are a choking hazard for young children.
